To promote the personal development of children, youth and adults through cultural education while providing resources that contribute to cross-cultural understanding between Hmong and non-Hmong people.



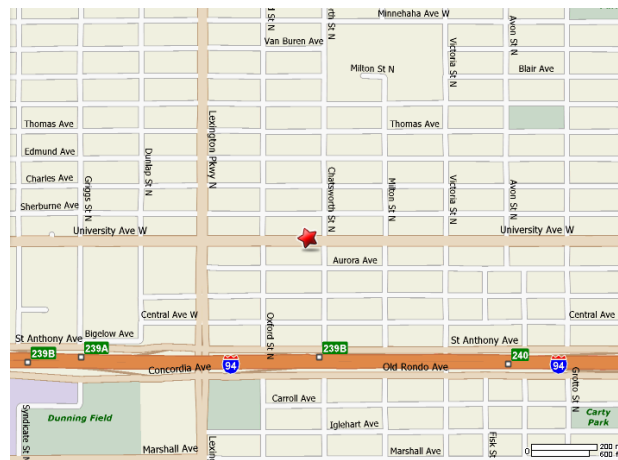

What is offered at the Hmong Cultural Center?

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION AND LITERACY PROGRAM

The program is open to everyone over the age of 18 and its goal is to promote personal development, self-sufficiency, and reduce dependency for Hmong adults by effectively preparing them for their new employment and life in America. The program is divided into two parts: the citizenship classes and the ESL (English as Second Language) classes.
